#### Agreement Between Houston County and Robinson Paving Company

This agreement between Houston County Board of Commissioners and Robinson Paving Company is for partial excavation for the enlargement of the detention pond at the *Houston County Courthouse Expansion* project on the Perry Parkway.

The scope of the work in this agreement involves the excavation of dirt from the site for Robinson Paving Company's use on projects nearby including but not limited to Lake Joy Road Phase 5 Improvement, and State Route 127/ Houston Lake Road Widening.

Robinson Paving Company agrees to excavate and remove soil from the pond to an elevation of plus or minus of contour 342. Robinson Paving agrees to construct and maintain a haul road, construct and maintain a construction exit, control dust, provide their own construction stakeout, and installation of a steel plate to the face of the existing outlet structure as detailed on plans. Robinson Paving Company shall maintain positive drainage with the excavation.

**RE:** Water Purchase Request from City of Warner Robins

Please find attached a request from the City of Warner Robins to serve *Pete's Hollandia Greenhouse* under our city/county water purchase agreement. The proposed development will be located in the Warner Robins/Peach County Industrial Park and will be served via an existing master meter permitted in August 2018. This previous agreement (9/4/18) was to provide water and fire protection to the Pure Flavor facility. At that time, Carter & Sloope analyzed our water system and determined that it could provide services without significant degradation of performance for existing customers.

Warner Robins is constructing a water treatment facility that is scheduled to be operating before the Hollandia Greenhouse is completed. Once the City facility is on-line, it will be able to meet the demand. Therefore, this extension of the system off the existing master meter is temporary and for fire flow protection. The original Carter & Sloope analysis confirmed the ability of the County water system to meet NFPA requirements. This request does not require any taps to the water system, and the rate was set with the original installation of the master meter.

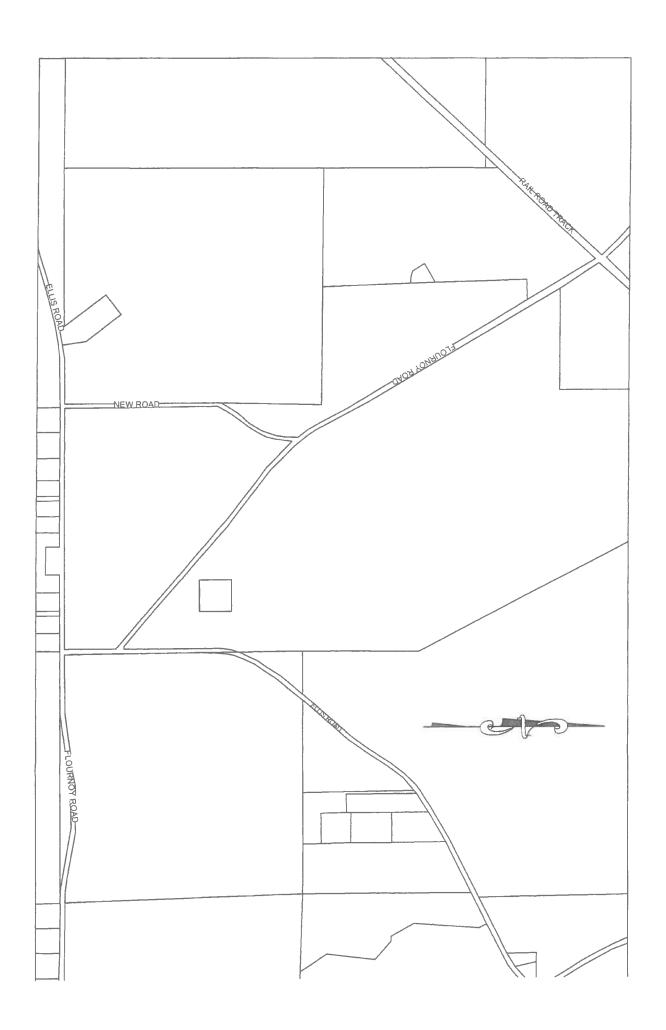

Abandonment of New Road

Staff would like for the Board of Commissioners to consider abandoning New Road. Mr. Perfect has agreed to donate 80' of right-of-way needed to pave Flournoy Road in exchange for the abandonment of New Road. This donated right-of way would be East of Ellis Road on Flournoy which is a 2001 SPLOST Project. It would also include the right-of-way west of Ellis Road to the paved section of Flournoy Road just south of the railroad tracks. Currently, Mr. Perfect owns the properties on both sides of New Road and Flournoy Road as shown in the attached sketch. In addition to abandoning New Road Mr. Perfect would like for new pasture fencing to be installed along Flournoy Road with the road project. This right-of-way donation for the paving of Flournoy Road would greatly benefit the County.

#### AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2021 by and between the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HOUSTON COUNTY, (hereinafter referred to as the "County"), and PERFECT'S ELKO PROPERTIES, LLC., (hereinafter referred to as "Owner").

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Owner is the owner of the property located along an unpaved portion of Flournoy Road and the owner of the property the entirety of which New Road traverses, the property is more particularly described in the Warranty Deed attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, Owner had expressed a desire to donate some of his property that abuts Flournoy Road to give way to an 80' right-of-way so the unpaved portion of Flournoy Road can be paved and in return he ask that the County abandon New Road then convey that property back to him since he owns on both sides of New Road its entire length; and

WHEREAS, Owner has also requested that new pasture fencing be installed along Flournoy Road as part of the road paving project.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual benefits to the Parties hereto it is agreed as follows:

1.
