The Purchasing Department solicited prices for One (1) New 2026 Tandem Dump Truck in March for the Houston County Roads & Bridges Department.

It is recommended that the Houston County Board of Commissioners purchase the Tandem Dump Truck from Middle Georgia Freightliner for \$154,500.00 which has a shorter lead time over the low bid from Peach State Truck Centers. (The difference only being \$106.00) Also, Middle Georgia Freightliner has a Detroit Engine while Peach State Truck Centers has a Cummins, so for commonality of tooling the Detroit would be preferred. The new unit will replace a 2007 Sterling Tandem Dump Truck with 395,346 miles. It will be charged to the 2018 SPLOST account 320-4200-54.2200.
