Please consider this request below from the City of Perry to serve a development under our city/county water purchase agreement.

1. Agricultural Estates- Moss Oaks Road, Perry, Georgia Parcel No. 0P0340 068000 8-Inch Municipal Master Meter

This development was reviewed by the Water Department and our consultants to verify flow and pressure. There is an adequate water supply to meet the needs of this development. This request is contingent upon the developer posting a bond of 125 percent of the construction cost for work performed on the Houston County Water System. In keeping with the Water Use Agreement between the Houston County Board of Commissioners and the City of Perry, please consider approval.

Re: Timber Harvest – Landfill Tract

Public Works staff and American Forest Management, Inc. recommends the sale of timber at the Landfill to include 86 acres to be clearcut of mature saw timber pine. This area is to be replanted after harvest. Also, it is recommended we harvest 20 acres of nonmerchantable timber that will be in the future landfill expansion.

Estimated revenue from sale - \$275,000 Estimated reforestation cost - \$310 per acre

American Forest Management, Inc. will monitor local timber markets and bid the timber sale accordingly. The sale area was reviewed by Atlantic Coast Consulting, and they concur with the sale. A recommendation letter from American Forest Management, Inc. and map are attached. Staff recommends proceeding with the timber sale.

4. Approval of Rate Adjustment – Commissioner Gottwals

This request from Public Works is for an adjustment to disposal rates.				
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the increase in solid waste collection and landfill disposal rates by 5.2%, or \$1.20 which will be effective April 1, 2025 based on the *U.S. Department of Labor Consumer Price Index (CPI)* for water, sewer, and trash. Landfill disposal rates will also increase by 5.2% per ton for all categories effective the first billing cycle after July 1, 2025. Landfill disposal rates will be adjusted annually thereafter based on the current rate for the January Consumer Price Index for sewer, water and trash.

CPI Adjustments - Waste Management and Landfill

Based on our current amendment to the Solid Waste Collection Service Agreement, Exhibit "A", the compensation payable to the contractor shall be annually adjusted by the same percentage as the Consumer Price Index for water, sewer and trash.

Public Works staff recommend using the current rate of 5.2% for January 2025 from the U.S. Department of Labor Consumer Price Index for water, sewer and trash. It is further recommended that the increase of \$1.20 effective April 1, 2025, not be passed through to the customers currently. This agreement is set to expire on June 30, 2025.

Subsequently all Landfill disposal rates will also increase by 5.2% per ton for all categories effective the first billing cycle after July 1, 2025. It is further recommended that the Landfill disposal rates be adjusted annually thereafter based on the current rate for January each year based on the Consumer Price Index for sewer, water and trash.

5. Annual Road Race to Benefit Central GA Alzheimer's Association – Commissioner Byrd

A request was received from Mr. John Rowlands, Race Director of the Annual "Run 2 End Alzheimer's at the Landings" to benefit Alzheimer's, for approval of a race on Saturday, April 5, 2025. The Landing Pointe Plaza in Bonaire will serve as both the start and finish for the 5K and 10K runs. The Statham's Landing Homeowners' Association and the owners of the Landing Pointe shopping center have both approved the event and the date; additionally, the Central Georgia Alzheimer's Association supports and endorses this event. The Sheriff's Department has agreed to help with traffic control. Last year's event raised \$48,000 for the Alzheimer's Association, which is a direct reflection of our generous and concerned community.
